## INTRODUCTION

Cataract, generally defined as opacity of the crystalline lens of the eye is a major cause of visual impairment and blindness worldwide. This disorder, which has been documented since very early times, was recognized by the twenty-eighth WHO Assembly in 1975 as one of the most important causes of avoidable blindness.

Cataract accounts for nearly half of all blindness, and is particularly common in developing countries. The grim fact is that there exist a formidable total of some 15.8 million people needlessly blind from cataract. With rapid "greying" of population, the problem of blindness from cataract will assume even more staggering proportions in the future.

In the present state of knowledge, there's no proven means of preventing cataract or it's progression to blindness. The condition is, however, amenable to surgical treatment, which, together with the optical correction of the ensuing refractive deficit, results in the restoration of vision.

In developed countries, the availability of eye care services to those blind from cataract ensures that large majority have their sight restored. In contrast, in the developing countries, in which the majority of the cataract blind are found, there has been, over the years, an accumulation of unattended people blind from cataract, resulting in what is commonly known as the "cataract backlog".

It has therefore become imperative that programmes and partners involved in the control of blindness include intervention for surgical treatment to restore vision in person blind cataract.

## ACTIVITIES BEFORE THE CAMP

The eye unit has always put emphasis on community eye screening in remote villages and hard to reach areas. The main aim and objectives for doing that is to identify cataracts and other ocular condition and also to provide eye care services to the doorsteps of the people especially the rural poor.

The idea of launching an appeal for a cataract camp to the NEPH and Partners came immediately after my January 2021 Annual leave, When I resumed work there were a lot of cataract cases waiting and most of them were bilaterally blind and poor, they could not afford to pay for the surgery fees, admissions fees and travel expenses as most of them were older people who had been affected by the coronavirus lockdown. Most of these people depend on their families and the family members do not consider cataract surgery as a priority in their plans.

The NEHP manager was able to contact our esteem partners, the charity Cataracts are Curable through their Gambian counterpart Mr. Alhasan Touray who were ready to sponsor a community eye screening program in the North Bank East Region and Kaur health centre catchment area in Central River Region North.

A community eye screening budget proposal was sent to our esteem partners through the NEHP manager. However, the budget proposal was approved after a thorough scrutiny by our esteem partners Cataracts Are Curable in the United Kingdom. The funds were disbursed into the NEHP Bank account. Below is a table showing the budget proposal.

A community eye screening work plan in the North Bank East Health region was produced and shared with all stakeholders. Below is a table showing the work plan for the community screening;

The sensitisation through the two community Radios in Farafenni i.e. Paradise FM Radio station and the Farafenni Community Radio station started 3 days before the screening activities in all the health facilities in order to mobilise the people in the communities who really need the services. Another Community radio station in Kerewan, called Kerewan Community FM Radio station was also contracted to do the community sensitisation in that area as planned.

Furthermore, we also used the structures in the community to do the sensitisation like the officers-in charge of Health centres, Community Health Nurses, Public health officers, village health workers, traditional birth attendants and optical leads to do vigorous sensitisation in the communities.

The sensitisation was successful except in Kerewan where we could not reach the communities on time due to communication breakdown between the officer in charge and the community health workers which resulted to the low turnout during the screening period.

## Challenges of the community screening exercise

1. lack of a trekking vehicle for community screening and outreach clinics and surgery
2. Shortage of staff, currently there's no Ophthalmic Medical Assistants and community Ophthalmic Nurses in the Farafenni General Hospital secondary eye unit and at community level.
3. The primary health care approach or structures of the eye health program has failed, the "Nyateros" (Friends of the Eyes) and the optical lead volunteers are no more due lack of motivation and training. Some of the Nyateros has passed away long time and they have not been replaced and the ones alive have not been given continued education training and support to empower and encourage them to continue the work in their various communities.
4. The integrated eye health workers programme and training has stopped and currently none of the health centre staff, who were trained on the integrated eye health work, are in those health facilities; nearly all those trained have been redeployed to other health programmes.
5. The screening team is ill equipped, especially in terms of eye health diagnostic tools like portable slit lamp, portable tonometer and E-charts
6. Shortage of examination and anaesthetic eye medication.

The above-mentioned problems are essential requirement for effective and efficient community eye health services.

## NORTH BANK EAST HEALTH REGION AND KAUR CATCHMENT AREA CATARACT CAMP

A work plan was prepared in order to start the surgery in the shortest possible time. The following table shows the work plan indicating the sites chosen for the outreach and based surgeries and the targeted number of surgeries in each catchment area.

The sensitisation for the surgery was done through the same media outlets that was use previously during the community screening period, that is the community Radios in Farafenni and Kerewan and the other community structures like sharing the information in the NBER's officers in- charge WhatsApp page, CHN/ VHS, VHWs and TBAs and also by telephone calls of patients who have contact numbers.

A planning meeting was convened at the eye clinic and various people were assigned to purchase and gather all the materials, drugs and equipment requirements of the camp before the dates for the first outreach camp.

We started with Kaur Health Centre Cataract Camp which was scheduled for the 20/5/21. We left Farafenni on this date around 11:00 o'clock in the morning with a team of 5 people. The table below shows the composition of the team members:

We were also able to engage the services of the following Staff in Kaur Health Centre.

1. One orderly to help in the scrubbing and cleaning of the proposed room for the eye surgery and other assignments as deem necessary.
2. Two cooks who were responsible for preparing food for the patients and staff
3. The generator operator was also put on board to take care of electricity in case NAWEC goes off suddenly and other minor electrical repairs and maintenance.

The clinic was full of people waiting for the camp to start. We started to review the patients one by one, by taking their vital signs, visual acuity, intra-ocular pressures, dilating and consent so that those who are deem fit for surgery could be identified. This review process took us up to 1700hrs.

The theatre was prepared and the surgery started at 2200hrs until 5:00 am and 20 cataract cases were operated during the night.

The 2nd day started with the review of the 1st batch of patients who were examined, given medication and discharged to continue their treatment at home. They were given health talk on the Do's and Don'ts of cataract surgery and a one week appointment was given to them for another review.

The remaining patients and other patients who just heard about the free cataract camp were waiting. They all went through the review protocol and 13 operable cataract cases were admitted for surgery.

The surgery started a bit earlier than the previous day and all of them were successfully operated before midnight. They were reviewed the following day and discharged home with their treatment and appointment for review.

The Community Radios and grass root community sensitisation for the free cataract camp continued especially in the central and lower Badibu district where the outreach camp was scheduled to take place.

### **The Kerewan Outreach Cataract Camp**

The camp was meant for the people from the remote and hard to reach areas of this two districts mention above and the reason why Kerewan was chosen for the camp site is they have a better facility that can accommodate the camp in terms theatre space and accessibility.

The camp started on the 1st of June and ended on the 3rd of June 2021. A total of 26 cataract cases were successfully operated. First batch was 9 cases and the 2nd batch was 17 cases. The reason for the increase was due to increased number of radio sensitisation spots and the 2nd reason was others were motivated by the good outcome of the 1st batch.

Although the targets were not met in the two outreach camps in Kaur and Kerewan but the ones operated were very successful and that really motivated the ones who were sceptical and later we saw most of them coming to the Camp in Farafenni General Hospital.

However, there were many interesting cases but I would like to highlight two most important and interesting cases which were very profound; one is Kumba Jallow, an eighty(80) years old woman who was blind for about 2yrs and the left eye was permanently blind. In short this is a case referred to as an only eye. Actually by right it's the consultant ophthalmologist who should operate this type of cases but



the reason why I operated her was, she is very old and from a very poor background and to my own assessment if I refer her to Sheikh Zayed Regional Eye Care centre she won't be able to go due to her age, financial and other social issues. The other reason was the assessment of the only eye shows that it is a simple operable cataract, so I decided to use my own clinical judgement to operate her and all thanks and praises be to the Almighty Allah it was successfully done without complication. There was a short video on her before and after the surgery.

The 2nd case was one Binta Ceesay a 70 year old woman from Njaba Kunda with bilateral mature cataracts who progressed to total blindness for an estimated period of two months.

The first eye was operated in Kerewan and the 2nd eye was successfully operated at Farafenni camp and her vision is totally restored. She was also part of the case study with a short video before and after the surgery.

## Farafenni General Hospital Cataract Camp

The Farafenni General Hospital free cataract camp started on the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 2021. The targeted number of patients was 75 but after meeting the target we continue to receive patients from the outreach camp areas some of whom were part of those who were booked in those centres. We also started to see patients from Senegal whose coming can be attributed to the massive sensitisation on the community radio.

The base surgery was initially conducted twice a week but later on as the number reduces we operate on weekly basis.

Some patients were bilaterally blind in the previous camp had the chance of their second eyes been operated in farafenni.

The free cataract camp ended on the 10<sup>th</sup> of August 2021. A total of one hundred and twenty three (123) patients operated in the Farafenni.

## Achievements

- The sensitisation was good as the turnout was very impressive.
- The camp was very successful, as about 95% of the patients have intra-ocular lens implants; only few are Aphakic as a result of hyper maturity of cataracts and other ocular morbidities.
- Some patients were bilaterally blind of cataract, so this camp gave them the opportunity to be operated free of charge on both eyes and now their sights have been restored
- One school girl's cataract was also successfully operated.
- We were able to meet the target despite many challenges.
- There was a very good team work; everyone was focused and ready to sacrifice time, extra effort and energy.
- Patients came in a distressful condition but we were able to put a smile on their faces when they were going home.

## Constraints

- Lack of a trekking vehicle and fuel for outreach clinics and surgeries to the remote and hard to reach areas of the secondary eye unit in the catchment area. We depend on the RHD for transportation but sometimes we do have problems of transport especially when our programs coincide with their activities.
- Lack of proper theatre set up in the major health canters, inadequate water supply and lack Air conditioner in the theatres.
  - Shortages of ophthalmic nurses.
  - Lack of laptop computer in the unit which makes reporting on time very difficult.
